Remembering Our Seniors

Studies show that many Americans are depressed and some people have committed suicide. Also, remember that May is Mental Health Awareness Month. Although we should distance ourselves, please ask yourself how you might help our seniors who are at risk. Some live alone, don't drive, don't have access to transportation, and don't hear from anyone. Please strive to:

- 1. Call a senior daily. A five-minute call is better than nothing.
- 2. Let them know that you are thinking of them.
- 3. Let them know that you care about them.
- 4. Offer to pick up items for them (medication, groceries, stamps, etc.)
- 5. Send them cards.
- 6. Drive by parades (balloons, signs, etc.).
- 7. Provide a sing alone outside of their house.
- 8. Ask your children to make homemade cards for them.
- 9. Ask your children to call them to say hello.
- 10. Brainstorm ideas with the YPDers and YAMs during a conference call to get ideas of what can be done.
- 11. Ask if they have completed their Census. If not, assist them.
- 12. Ask if they have filled out an absentee ballot for voting. If not, assist them.
- 13. Take them a hot balanced meal.
- 14. If the Meals on Wheels are operational in your area, strive to get the senior in your area on their list if they are not already participating.
- 15. Check to see if the Brown Bag Ministry is available in your area. If so, strive to get your senior in your area on their list if they meet the financial guidelines.

Caring for our elders is a privilege; therefore, show respect when interacting with them. Listen to them for they have a wealth of knowledge and experience to share. Thank them for the lessons that have taught us; for their sacrifices they have made for us; and for the times they encouraged us and celebrated us.

Southeast WMS To Do List

- Local Presidents: Your local roll was due to the Conference President and Historiographer/Statistician before the Southeast Annual Institute. Since it was canceled, it is still due. Now that we are quaranteened in our homes, this is a perfect time for the Local Presidents to make contact with their members. An Excel spreedsheet is due to the Connectional Office; therefore, please prepare your roll and send it to the SE Conference.
 - We realize that the Local WMS Roll is larger than the Area and Conference Rolls.
 - Members don't attend the Southeast Annual WMS Convention.
 - Members don't pay the Area Dues nor do they attend Area Meetings.
 - Some churches don't hold local meetings and don't collect local dues.
 - To keep one's name on the Conference Roll, one must register (pay registration fee) and attend an Annual Convention. If members don't attend:
 - They should register and send a letter to the Area Chair asking to be excused from the Convention.
 - Only the Area Chair can answer roll for members who are not in attendance; of course, they must register.
 - The Conference President will be mailing a spreedsheet to all whose email addresses she has. She is asking individuals to please assist the Local President in completing this task so that the Conference will be able to meet their deadline.
