Missionaries & YPDers,

The 2024 WMS and YPD Institutes are history. Although I missed the Southwest Institute, all reports indicated that it, too, was fruitful. The Southeast institute closed the season. Thank you to all 9th District missionaries, young people, and children. President Whiting, your first series of institutes added another star to your inaugural presidential year!

On another note...recently, I read Galatian 6. Although I considered myself as being very familiar with the chapter, for the first time, I received a different angle on the message. Verses 7 and 8 tell readers, "Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life."

In relation to the chapter's theme, these verses mean that persons who teach God's word should receive support from the people they teach. This instruction includes but is not limited to financial support. Paul is clear: giving to those who teach the word isn't a "payment; it's sharing.

Paul continues by indicating that givers reap what givers sow. God rewards us for our sharing. When we give little, we receive little. When we give big, we receive big. This is simple math. Who wants to receive big? Who wants to receive little? How we give determines our return. If you want a lot *from* God, then give a lot to God. (God knows our individual "big" and "little".)

What was my different angle on this scripture? For some, this might be a stretch, but I believe we also should apply Galatians 6:7, 8 to our personal spiritual development. What we sow in ourselves determines what we reap. When I sow negative thoughts, cloudy options, and "life-will-never-get-better-for-me" thoughts into my spirit, that's what I reap. However, when I sow positive thoughts that remind me that I belong to God who promises to take care of me and I do right by God and feed good, healthy, productive, overcoming, more-than-a-conqueror celebratory thoughts in my spirit, that's what I reap.

How can I sow positive thoughts into my life? I can do so by spending time with God in praying (listening and speaking to God); praising (thanking God); worshiping (focusing on who God is) fellowshipping (attending church regularly); studying (setting aside time to read and learn from God's word); and serving (using the gifts God gave you to bless others).

Sowing into our personal spiritual life makes us stronger Christians. We become familiar with God and God's word. We learn what to expect from and expect God to keep God's word. We live with an "I-know-God's-got-me" attitude. We focus more on what we have. We look for God's hand in our life, and as we receive, we share.

Declare today: not only will I support ministries, but also, I will sow positive thoughts in my life.




