

9th Nistrict BOOK CLUB


Who: Missionaries and YPD'ers 12 years or older and those who love to read books.







YPD Initiative: At-Home Library



Research Overview: Studies have consistently shown that children who reside in homes with extensive home libraries tend to read more frequently, develop advanced reading skills, and achieve higher levels of education compared to their peers who have limited access to books. This correlation remains significant even after accounting for variables such as parental education levels. Notable research conducted by Crook (1997), de Graaf et al. (2000), and others (including Georg, 2004; Park, 2008; Teachman, 1987) highlights the positive impact of book availability on children's literacy development and educational attainment.

Rationale for the Initiative: The primary objective of this initiative is to enhance a literacy-rich environment in homes, particularly in economically challenged households. By providing access to a diverse range of books, the program aims to foster a love for reading among children, thereby helping to bridge the reading gaps that often exist in underserved communities.

Program Goal: The initiative seeks to empower designated students by supplying them with ageappropriate books to establish an at-home library. This approach is designed not only to enhance individual literacy skills but also to promote lifelong reading habits.

Distribution Plan: Each conference will coordinate the procurement and distribution of books, ensuring that a local Title 1 school is selected in collaboration with the Episcopal District Young People's & Children's Division (YPD) Director, the Conference Director, and the Connectional Literacy Chairperson. The distribution will consist of five carefully chosen books, one tote bag for easy transport, and a bookmark to encourage reading.

Grade-Level Assignments for Book Provision: The conferences will supply books tailored to the specific educational needs of students based on their grade levels:

- **Alabama River Region** Kindergarten
- **Northeast Alabama Conference** Second Grade
- **Northwest Alabama Conference** Third and Fourth Grades
- **Southeast Alabama Conference** Fifth Grade
- **Southwest Alabama Conference** First Grade

Initial Support and Future Funding: The Episcopal District YPD Director will contribute the initial set of tote bags for this initiative, marking the first step in the program's rollout. To ensure sustainability and the continued success of the at-home library program, plans are in place to seek additional support through donations from private individuals and businesses, as well as various available grants. This proactive approach will help secure the necessary resources to expand and enhance the literacy opportunities for children in the community.
