As you read through this newsletter, please have your calendars nearby. There are so many upcoming activities and or events and we need and want YOU to be a part of them! Please meet me there!!



NATIONAL BLACK VOTER DAY TOOLKIT

THE ISSUE:

The 2025 elections are underway, the 2026 midterm elections are fast approaching, and attempts at voter suppression are in effect. This includes:

- Efforts to gerrymander and dilute voting districts in Texas, a move that other states including Missouri, Indiana, and more are attempting to do. Many Southern states are heavily gerrymandered already. However, this is a multiregional effort to undermine voting through gerrymandering.
- An effort by the current administration to target mail in ballots
- An effort by the DOJ to breach state voting systems
- Two Supreme Court cases that could further erode the Voting Rights Act

These efforts will significantly impact voters, especially Black voters who are disproportionately impacted by these efforts to suppress the vote.

THE ASK:

September 18th is National Black Voter Day and we want you to make your voices heard. We are asking you to call your elected officials and encourage them to protect voting. This includes calling for the passage of the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act. We are also asking you to take to social media and voice your support for voting protection. We want to continue to champion voting rights.

We are also asking you to continue to elevate this message beyond September 18th. As we go into 2026 we must continue to ramp up our efforts to protect voting rights. Make your voices heard!





As has been the custom of the African Methodist Episcopal Church throughout the years, whenever a senior (missionary) group was formed, the next concern was for the children and young people of the church. During an Executive Board meeting in 1912 at Wilberforce University, the Women's Parent Mite Society, currently the Women's Missionary Society, began establishing a Young People's Department. At the **Quadrennial Session in October** 1915, the Women's Parent Mite Society formally adopted the Young People's Department.
